## INTRODUCTION

ITF Enhancing Human Security's Portfolio of Projects for 2025 is a strategic collection of projects in **28 countries/territories** and regions of Europe, South Caucasus, Africa, Middle East and Central Asia. ITF has developed it with its field partners and/or respective national or regional authorities. The Portfolio includes projects with already confirmed full funding, projects that require partial funding and projects that are not yet funded<sup>1</sup>.

The purpose of the Portfolio is to provide an overview of ITF's varied capacities and capabilities, as well as the needs of beneficiary countries/territories it has recognized and seeks to address. With partial or full implementation of the Portfolio, ITF will promote enhanced human security in post-conflict and developing countries/territories affected by landmines/explosive remnants of war or other impacts from conflict. Thereby, ITF will address a number of salient issues faced by affected societies, and advance its Strategy by following its established guiding principles.

ITF Portfolio of Projects 2025 includes **87 projects** in the total amount of more than 108 million USD. As a dynamic and ever-changing compilation, the Portfolio can serve as a cornerstone for the development of new project ideas by interested parties. ITF therefore encourages partners, donors, affected countries, (potential) beneficiaries and other interested parties to use the Portfolio as a resource for reasonable use of available resources or funding opportunities.

The goal of project is to strengthen the STSS capabilities, improving the institutional and technical expertise humanitarian demining and supporting the clearance activities in humanitarian mine action. One of the key responsibilities and priorities of the STSS is conducting underwater surveys and clearance operations of the waterways/ seashores/seaports, as well as railways, bridges and other critical infrastructure which play a vital role in facilitating the export of grain from Ukraine, thereby contributing to global food security.
38	Medical Rehabilitation of Victims of Armed Conflict	2025–2026	\$ 1,000,000 [NOT FUNDED] ○○○	The objective is to provide medical treatment and rehabilitation for 50 victims of Russian aggression on Ukraine. Victims, coming from the conflict affected areas in Ukraine, will receive adequate treatment at that will improve the health and general wellbeing. They will be also equipped with all the necessary medical devices (prosthesis, orthosis, wheelchairs, crutches, etc.). This will improve their level of physical health, decrease stress and trauma, which will enable them to participate in social and economic activities. Ultimately, this will reinstate them as equal and full members of their society.

Cleaning up the territory will take several years, hampering reconstruction efforts and preventing people from returning to their daily lives. The purpose of the project is to support operations of ITF Implementation Office in Kyiv, Ukraine. The main goal of this project is to provide civilian landmine/UXO victims with rehabilitation, psychosocial and socio- economic support, implement needs assessment and mine risk education activities.
